SUBJECT: HEALTH INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

I would like to alert you to the problem of head lice spreading in some of the public schools. **WE NEED YOUR COOPERATION TO PREVENT LICE FROM SPREADING.** Head lice can happen to anyone. It is not a sign of having poor health habits or being dirty. The most important fact to remember is that the problem should be quickly treated to stop the spread.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

1. Persistent scratching the head or back of the neck.
2. Lice are grayish brown in color and may be seen. Also, look for whitish eggs (nits), which can be mistaken for dandruff. Dandruff is removed easily from the hair or scalp. Nits are glued to the hair shaft and are hard to remove.

WHAT TO DO:

If you think you have a problem in your family, you can check with your doctor for treatment. There are also medicated shampoos available with a prescription at the drug store.

In addition to shampooing, all combs, brushes, clothing and bedding should be disinfected. Laundering, then a hot dryer is helpful. Head lice can spread if preventive measures are not taken. You can help by regularly inspecting your child's hair. **HAIR MUST BE FREE OF NITS BEFORE A CHILD MAY RETURN TO SCHOOL.**
